Kingdom of Belgium appoints permanent representative to OTIF

The Belgian Ambassador in Switzerland, H.E. Marc Van Craen ¹, was appointed as Belgium's permanent representative to OTIF. After the Kingdom of Spain, this is the second Member State which is using this explicit mandate from the capital to follow and contribute actively to the work of OTIF *in situ*, thereby fully exploiting the potential offered by the diplomatic environment in Berne.

Permanent representatives represent their country at international governmental organisations in the same way as Embassies do in their host countries. The Belgian Ambassador to the Swiss Confederation will now represent his country at OTIF, which also has its headquarters in Berne.
