Subject: Information from Italy on the results of the informal working group on

check-lists for the filling and emptying of liquefied gas tank-wagons (Mi-

lan, 27 and 28 October 2016)

## Information from Italy

- In accordance with the mandate from the RID Committee of Experts' standing working group (Berne, 23 and 24 May 2016) (OTIF/RID/CE/GTP/2016-A, paragraphs 21 to 24), Italy hosted the above-mentioned informal working group in order to develop further the check-lists for gas tank-wagons that had been submitted in document OTIF/RID/CE/ GTP/2016/5.
- 2. Bearing in mind that the mandate was "to develop further the check-lists for gas tank-wagons that had been submitted in document OTIF/RID/CE/GTP/2016/5" (which is not limited to leakage prevention), all participants agreed to develop a "reference tool" which, in terms of internal operational and specialist practices, could help fillers and unloaders carry out the obligations assigned in various chapters or provisions of RID.
- 3. At this first meeting, the proactive spirit of cooperation led to the completion of a point by point analysis of the proposed check-list attached to document OTIF/RID/CE/GTP/2016/5.
- 4. A preliminary draft text was prepared, which will be further developed and analysed by the associations and Member States' experts in the next few months:
  - to establish only those steps which are directly referred to in RID;
  - to use the same terminology as used in RID, as far as possible;

- to avoid, as far as possible, creating any kind of direct or indirect restrictions for operational instructions and procedures (each operator must be free to organise its own procedures).
- 5. Based on the above, the following timetable was agreed:
  - by the end of February 2017, all participants will provide comments and proposals on the proposed texts;
  - Italy will host a final session of the group during spring to prepare and approve the final text for the check-lists and to finalise the proposal to be submitted to the RID Committee of Experts' standing working group at its session in November 2017.
- 6. As many European Associations (EIGA, AEGPL, CEFIC) are involved in developing the document, Italy considers that at the end of the activities, the required "legal status" will be achieved.
